* *E-WASTE/E-CYCLE LAW * *

Electronics NOT accepted at the Transfer Station:

- Computers
- Computer monitors/ keyboards/mice
- Printers
- Microwave Ovens
- Televisions
- VCRs
- DVD players
- DVRs
- Telephones with video displays
- Fax Machines
- Other video display devices

* *TRASH * *

Materials NOT accepted in trash containers:

- Hazardous Wastes
- Yard Wastes
- Tires
- Freon items
- Appliances
- Computer equipment/ printers
- Fluorescent tubes/ lightbulbs/ballasts
- Hot Ashes
- Large Quantities of Construction Waste (more than one garbage bag or can)
- Recyclable Materials

**SCRAP METAL* *

Materials NOT accepted in scrap metal containers:

- Capacitors
- Ballasts
- Light Bulbs (all types)
- Mounted tires
- Ammunition (used or unused)
- Newer appliances that are mostly plastic.
- Appliances with Freon

Materials accepted in scrap metal containers:

- Steel, aluminum, galvanized, and cast iron items
- Bicycles (acceptable with tires and seats)
- Lawn mowers & snowblowers (all gas and oil drained completely, tires removed)
- Subject to change - non-freon appliances are currently being accepted
- Sealed units: propane tanks, freon tanks, hydraulic cylinders, air tanks, gas tanks, and units under pressure or containing oils – Units will be accepted only if cut open and crushed
- Compressed gas & oxygen bottles: Bottles must be drained, properly cleaned and one end of the container removed
- LP Tanks: completely purged and/or shot blasted to remove all residual chemicals
- Gas tanks: Drained and punched with a minimum of six holes on each side

* *SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING PROGRAM * *

Put **ALL** your recyclable items together in the **BLUE** recycling bag. All of your glass, plastic bottles, aluminum cans, tin cans, papers, junk mail and small broken down cardboard can be mixed together in a single blue recycling bag. Newspapers and Magazines no not need to be bundled and tied. You may place them in the blue recycling bag along with all your other recyclable items. Larger cardboard box's should still be broken down and

placed in the recycling container. All trash must still be kept separate and placed in a **CLEAR** bag in the trash container. Do not mix trash and recycling items together in the same bag.

The following items MAY be placed in the BLUE bag:

- Aluminum cans, trays & foil
- Steel & tin cans (food cans ONLY)
- Glass bottles & jars—clear, green & brown
- Newspapers (including inserts)
- Magazines, catalogs and phone books
- #1-#7 Plastics.
- Junk mail & envelopes (including windowed envelopes)
- Shredded paper
- Brown paper bags
- Cardboard (broken down-no waxed cardboard)
- Office, computer, and notebook
- Chipboard (cereal, cake & food mix boxes, any plastic liners removed)
- Carrier stock (soda & beer carrying cases)
- Paperback books (hard cover with front and backs removed)

The following items MAY NOT be placed in the BLUE bag. Place in CLEAR trash bag.

- Plastic Bags & Aluminum Foil
- Plastic Toys & flower pots
- Household Trash/Garbage
- Polystyrene
- Styrofoam
- Window or Auto Glass
- Insecticide, herbicide or hazardous chemical containers
- Light Bulbs
- Frozen food boxes
- Pizza boxes or carryout wrappers
- Dairy carton boxes
- Holiday wrapping paper
- Contaminated Paper
- Ceramics
- Drinking glasses
- Tissue products/paper toweling
- Plastic Film (plastic sheets, tarps or wrap)
